LOCATION:

Jefferson is in the Southeast area of Wisconsin, 6 miles south of I-94 between Madison and Milwaukee at the intersection of Highways 18 and 26.

ZONING:

The City of Jefferson also has a zoning ordinance, comprehensive plan, and a plan commission to insure orderly growth and to guarantee long range protection of both economic and natural resources. Commercial building is by approval of Planning Commission.

MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT:

The City of Jefferson operates under a Mayor/Council form of Government. The Mayor and the eight member City Council are elected on a non-partisan basis for overlapping two-year terms. In 1977, a Charter Ordinance establishing the position of City Administrator was adopted by the Council. This position is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the city.

POLICE PROTECTION:

The City of Jefferson consists of Chief Gary Bleecker, Captain Michael Drew, Lieutenant Dale Lutz, 2 Detectives, 9 full time patrol officers, 6 part time officers, 2 full time dispatchers, an Office Secretary and Typist.

FIRE PROTECTION

The Fire Department operates with 45 volunteers. The Jefferson Fire Department equipment includes 4 pumpers, 2 tankers, and aerial ladder and van. The Fire Underwriters rating in the City of Jefferson is 5.

The City provides standard services such as street maintenance, snow removal, and refuse collection and disposal.

The City of Jefferson contracts with John's Pickup Service for municipal pickup.

The City of Jefferson is also the location for the Jefferson County Building/Jefferson County Courthouse.

PARKS AND RECREATION:

The city of Jefferson owns and maintains 8 parks totaling 40 acres of developed open space and an additional 36 acres which are to be developed and will include walking paths, lookouts, playgrounds, open green space, and wetland restoration.

The developed parks offer the following amenities:

- Family Aquatic Center that features a pool with zero depth, heated water, and a 120 foot water slide
- 12 tennis courts (2 lighted)
- 2 baseball diamonds (1 lighted)
- 3 softball diamonds (2 lighted)
- 2 little league diamonds (1 lighted)

- sand volleyball courts
- ice skating rink and warming shelter
- playground areas
- picnic shelters
- boat launch
- boat dock
- areas for passive recreation activities such as fishing and family picnic areas

The city's Recreation Department offers over 40 programs for youth, adults, and senior citizens. These programs are offered year round and range from Parent & Tot swim lessons to coed Softball to Adult Volleyball to Senior Citizen Water exercise. The organization of monthly specialty day trips is also provided by the Recreation Department.

The Jefferson Public Library offers the community a wide range of recreational and learning opportunities, including the Summer Library Program for children of all ages, Pre-School Story Hour and other library-oriented programs for both adults and youth throughout the year. There is a monthly book discussion group for adults, and efforts are currently under way to establish Mother/Daughter and Father/Son book discussion groups. There are four public access computers with Internet access in the adult department. These also provide word processing and access to statewide databases. Basic Internet classes are offered free of charge during the school year as interest demands and staffing allows. The three computers in the children's department feature educational and recreational software. The library also offers the community access to a high quality copy machine, a microfilm/microfiche reader/printer, and a fax machine for receipt or transmission of messages as well as limited laminating service and access to a die cut machine and a growing number of dies.

The Jefferson Public Library recently joined with the public libraries in Fort Atkinson and Palmyra to create a shared catalog called B.R.I.D.G.E.S. By doing so anyone registered at one of the member libraries is automatically registered at all three, and is eligible to use any and all resources on an equal basis. Access to all holdings of the three libraries is available in each library. In addition, by logging onto the Library's website, anyone is able to search for materials on a

given subject or by a particular author. The website also allows registered users to place holds and renew items checked out to them at any of the three libraries. Through membership in the Mid-Wisconsin Federated Library System, title and subject request can be supplied from libraries throughout the state of Wisconsin and beyond.

JEFFERSON'S TRANSPORTATION**HIGHWAYS**

Interstate Highway 94 is located six miles north and Interstate Highway 90 is located 20 miles southwest of the city. USH 18, STH 26 and STH 89, and CTH J, CTH K, CTH N, and CTH W serve the City of Jefferson.

AIR SERVICE

There are three public use airports located within Jefferson County—Fort Atkinson Municipal, Palmyra Municipal, and Watertown Municipal. Jefferson is also served by the Dane County Regional Airport in Madison, which is thirty miles southwest via Interstate Highway 94, Mitchell Field Airport in Milwaukee, which is sixty miles east via Interstate Highway 94, and O'Hare International Airport in Chicago, which is one hundred miles southeast via Interstate Highway 90.

The Fort Atkinson Municipal Airport accommodates aircraft with 380-0 feet of paved, lighted runway with an instrument approach.

The Watertown Municipal Airport is located approximately 14 miles north of Jefferson. The airport provides two hard-surface runways. The airport provides full aviation services to include fuel, maintenance, hangars, and tie-downs. Both Avfuel and Jet A are available. The airport is open seven days a week, and its unicom is 122.8. After hours, runway lighting is pilot-controlled.

PUBLIC, PRIMARY, AND SECONDARY EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

The Public Education System for the City of Jefferson is provided through the School District of Jefferson, a Unified School District observing students from the pre-kindergarten through grade 12. The School District encompasses an area of 94 square miles, including the City of Jefferson and the Villages of Helenville, Rome, and Sullivan. The School District of Jefferson operates five school buildings, including three elementary schools, one middle school, and a high school. The elementary schools house grades K-5, the middle school grades 6, 7, and 8, and the high school grades 9-12. Two of the 3 elementary schools are located in the City of Jefferson...one serving the east side and one serving the west side of the city. The third elementary school is located in the village of Sullivan and serves the families in Sullivan, Rome, and Helenville, along with the rural families in that area of the school district. The Jefferson Middle School and the Jefferson High School are both located in the city of Jefferson and serve students from throughout the 94 square mile district.

28 special education teachers, psychologists, and social workers provide students with disabilities and exceptional education needs with a full continuum of special education and related services. Students with exceptional talents have their needs addressed through the districts Challenge Program, directed by a teacher certified to teach gifted and talented students. The district also provides an array of instructional aide and support services throughout the 5 buildings.

Students in the Jefferson schools consistently demonstrate a high level of academic achievement measures to enrolled students beginning with the Iowa Basic Skills at the elementary level. The School District of Jefferson annually administers the Wisconsin Student Assessment System Achievement Test to students in grades 8 and 10. Students interested in post-secondary schooling typically elect to take the American College Test (ACT). Additional national college entrance tests are administered through the high school guidance department.

PRIVATE EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

The city of Jefferson is served by two religious affiliated elementary schools (noted above).

The CATS tests are administered to students enrolled at the St. John's the Baptist Catholic School, while St. John's Evangelical Lutheran School uses the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills. The average scores in all areas tested have historically been above the national average.

GRADUATE, UNDER GRADUATE, AND TECHNICAL
